



Thank you for recycling your e-Waste!

Here are other ways to help reduce the amount of trash you send to landfills and to keep the environment safer.

- To stop catalogs, visit www.catalogchoice.org.
- To stop unsolicited mail (as well as phone calls and email), visit: www.consumer.ftc.gov/articles/0262-stopping-unsolicited-mail-phone-calls-and-email.
- To dispose of prescription drugs safely and without harming the water supply, visit a Medicine Drop Box at any police station in Delaware County or at the county Government Center in Media. Medicines may be dropped in boxes anonymously and for free during regular business hours.
- Swarthmore Co-op accepts used wine bottle corks, sneakers and Brita filters, Brita pitchers and more: www.swarthmore.coop/community/brita-recycling/
- Check your township website to confirm what is accepted in your single-stream curbside recycling. Please note that plastic bags are not accepted.
- Clean and dry plastic bags may be recycled at most local grocery stores. Learn more and find a location at www.plasticfilmrecycling.org/s01/s01dropoff.html.
